

Multistate Professional Responsibility Examination (MPRE)

The MPRE is assembled and administered by ACT, Inc., on behalf of the National Conference of Bar Examiners (NCBE). The examination is administered three times per year (March, August and November) at established test centers across the country. The purpose of the MPRE is to measure the Applicant's knowledge and understanding of established standards related to a lawyer's professional conduct. The Georgia Board of Bar Examiners requires **ALL** Applicants to take and pass the MPRE with a scaled score of 75 or higher, prior to the issuance of a Certificate of Eligibility for Admission to Practice Law.

Applicants who have taken the MPRE and achieved a scaled score of 75 or higher should contact the NCBE at www.ncbex.org, to request to have the score forwarded directly to the Office of Bar Admissions. **The Board of Bar Examiners DOES NOT accept MPRE scores forwarded by Applicants.**

Applicants who have yet to take the MPRE must make arrangements with the NCBE at the time of the administration of the MPRE to have their score forwarded directly to the Office of Bar Admissions.
