After the applicant files the Petition for Admission for Foreign-Educated Applicants, they must:

- (1) upload proof of authorization to practice law in the foreign jurisdiction (in a duly authenticated translation, if not in English), consisting of official documentation (such as a letter of good standing) issued by the licensing authority of the foreign jurisdiction;
- (2) provide a certification letter from their LL.M. school showing that the LL.M. program leads to (or that the applicant has been awarded) an LL.M. degree that meets the requirements of Part B, Section 4(c)(3); and
- (3) cause their foreign law school transcript to be submitted to the Office of Bar Admissions directly from **either** the foreign law school **or** their LL.M. school. Instructions for submitting transcripts can be found here.
